February 4, 2025

Susan Wozniak, Membership introduced a guest, Jim Casey who shared information about himself and his corvette. He currently has a '99 C5 Metallic Red Convertible and lives in Arvada. He learned about the club when visiting with a current member when visiting the National Museum.

Minutes of the 5 February 2025 Meeting (Presidents Night)

The meeting was held at the RMMA Terminal Bldg, 11755 Airport Way, Broomfield CO. 36 member club representatives were signed in as was one individual member and several club presidents and guests. Officers present were Dick Thompson president; John Ehrlich 1st vice president; Calvin Craig 2nd vice president; Dick Fritz secretary and Tom Mansfield treasurer.

The meeting was called to order at 7:05 pm.

Legislative: Leo Boyle introduced Colorado Representatives Carlos Barron and Lori Garcia Sander who are cosponsors of HB25-1127, "Concerning authorization to operate surplus military vehicles on the road if registered with the Dept. of Revenue". This bill seeks to provide a way for collectors of these vehicles which currently cannot be titled or licensed to be legally owned and used. They described potential obstacles (e.g. emissions) which may come up in hearings. The first committee hearing will be Tuesday, February 11th beginning at 1:30 pm and car collectors are urged to attend (or at least contact their representatives.) It is urgent that the bill be passed out of committee so it can be moved on to the Finance Committee.

Minutes from the December 2024 meeting were accepted as published. There was no January 2025 meeting.

Treasurer's Report was presented with the acknowledgement that all account balances as of January 1 were reset to zero with surplus balances as of 31 December 2024 moved into the Reserve Account. 15 member clubs, one individual, and four associate members have renewed as of the end of January.

RMMA Airport Show 2024 and 2025: The winners of the 2024 Show were presented with embossed whiskey bottles: Best of Show: Erica Becker, 1935 Super 8 Packard; RMMA Staff pick: Zack Loffert, 1981 Delorean Time Machine. Rick Ruel announced that there will be a 2025 show committee meeting at RMMA on February 12th. The means of transporting spectators from parking to the show are still being discussed.

Tri-State Auto Exhibition (March 8-10): Samantha Baker reported that CCCC will have a booth in the Club Corner with space for 10 vehicles and CCCC will cover the entry cost. The cars to be displayed are yet to be finalized but Samantha needs to forward this info to Tri-State by this weekend.

Bylaws amendment: The amendments to the CCCC Bylaws that were presented at the September meeting were opened for discussion and no changes were entered. A vote was called for after confirming that the necessary quorum was in attendance. The amendment was approved unanimously.

Pioneer Rally Company: Taylor Still and Jamie Turner of the Pioneer Rally Company (www.pioneerrallycompany.com) described their plans to hold a four-day five-night rally in Colorado, September 7-12, 2025 attracting entrants of vintage cars and trucks through 1984. The route covers 1700 km (1000 miles) with 300 km (180 miles) of dirt and gravel roads.

SEMA Show 2025: John Ehrlich reported that SEMA did not authorize comp passes for the 2024 show in time for CCCC to hear from persons wanting to go. Ehrlich has called for applicants for the 2025 show to notify him of their intent so he can draw up a list if SEMA authorizes it. Applicants must be members of a current CCCC club, be a SEMA Action Committee member, and be over the age of 16.

Regalia: Tom Mansfield is taking orders for T-shirts with the CCCC logo. Dick Thompson is taking names for CCCC name tags, no cost to authorized club representatives.

Next meeting: Wednesday 5 March 2025, 7:30 pm at the Forney Transportation Museum.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:46 pm.

Make your dues and event payments with Zelle

Zelle is an online service provided by your bank that allows you to send money from your bank account to LGCA's bank account. Here's how it compares to other payment methods.

Cash payments can only be made at the monthly meetings.

Check payments cost you \$0.68 for postage and take 1 to 3 days for delivery.

PayPal payments cost you and LGCA. On a \$20 event fee you pay \$0.88 and LGCA pays \$1.22. It takes 1 to 3 days to transfer payments from PayPal to LGCA's bank account.

Zelle payments are free. No charge to you. No charge to LGCA. It takes 1 to 3 minutes to transfer the money from your bank account to LGCA's bank account.

Zelle is easy to use. It's one of the menu choices on your banks online banking service. To send money you need to provide LGCA's Zelle credentials. They are:

- 8) You will get an email confirming the payment was sent

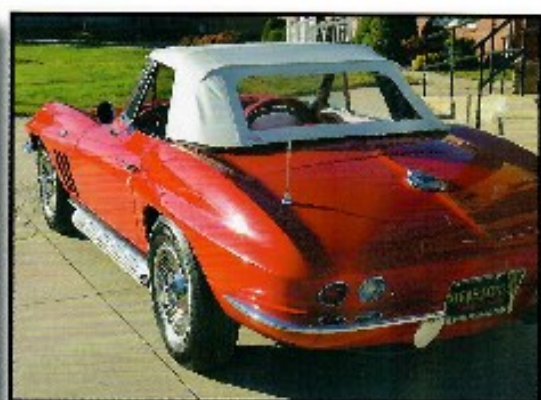
