LOOKING GLASS CORVETTE BUSINESS MEETING MINUTES June 4, 2024

The meeting was called to order by President Kathy Hall at 7:00 pm. Officers present were Kathy Hall, President, Sandy Seader, Vice President, Jane Walker, Secretary and Ken Pfohl, Treasurer. Bob Burroughs, Public Relations was absent.

Kathy Hall sadly announced that our dear member of 20 years, Shirley Salazar passed away after being in intensive care since Monday, June 3.

Susan Wozniak, Membership committee introduced a guest speaker from the Collector Car Council (CCC), Dick Thompson. Tom Mansfield is our club's representative and first vice President and will become President when Dick retires at the end of this year. Dick explained that the purpose of the council is 2-fold:

First is to promote our hobby by hosting events like the Rocky Mountain Car Show Swap Meet at the Broomfield Airport August 3 from 10 am – 2 pm. A \$10 donation per car and \$5 per adult spectator is suggested. It is a large event where there will be firetrucks, police cars and airplanes like the War Birds on display. There will also be a fly over by the Airshow Team.

Secondly to protect our hobby by using the dues of \$50 per club and \$4 per member of 56 car clubs to hire a lobbyist, Leo Boyle. His job is to see that any negative legislation doesn't get passed or is amended. Because of his effort and knowledge none of the 5 bills on Ozone regulations regarding emissions passed this term and saved us, oil and gas and agriculture from increased emissions standards and fees. Because of our lobbyist car enthusiasts have benefited immensely.

Tom Mansfield, Car Council Representative said there is a need for about 5 additional members to volunteer at the Forney Museum on June 15th for approximately 2 hours to dust and shine and enjoy viewing the cars.

Susan Wozniak, Membership committee was pleased to welcome new members that were voted into the club: Wayne Hodapp, Susan Morris, Kathy and Rodney Kellett. We had a first time visitor Lewis Kilborn. He has a 2004 LeMans edition and a '75 coupe that is not legal – it is literally a street rod!

Ken Pfohl, Treasurer went over the Profit and Loss statement for January through May highlighting the income/expenses for May. He also provided a handout about the use of Zelle for payments to and reimbursements from the club. There will be an article in the Reflections explaining the use of Zelle.

Jane Walker, Secretary inquired about members that may need the silver dangles for their name tags. If that is the case just let her know. She will be ordering name tags for the new members and would be happy to include any needed with the order. Her daughter-in-law can make the Corvette carve out and paint them in any color for any members that are interested. They are \$10 each.

Sandy Seader, Vice President announced June birthdays. She shared a story of challenging the "Road Closed" signs on the way to the Wild Animal Sanctuary – and she won arriving without incident!! There were 12 cars that participated in the May 27 Memorial Day parade.

She thanked the social committee for the excellent job they did in organizing events.

Kathy Hall, President reiterated what a great parade it was. It is well attended and the crowds are energetic and appreciative. However, she reminded and encouraged members to please notify organizers if they cannot attend an event they signed up for as the club is obligated to pay for the number they reserve for.

Social Committee Chair Judy Nielsen reported:

Forty-seven members attended the tour of Empower Field and had lunch at "The Original Brooklyn's."

Plans for the Father's Day Car Show in Gering, NE have been finalized with seventeen cars going to Gering on June 13.

The committee is still discussing what arrangements for lunch after the Rosemount Museum & River Walk in Pueblo on June 29 would work the best for the group.

Details for the trip to Lincoln, NE for the Museum of American Speed July 7-10 are still being worked out. There is a link on the flyer where you can book the hotel. There is one couple that will join the group in Sterling to caravan to Lincoln.

A trip to the Dougherty Museum in Longmont is being planned for July 27.

A mystery trip is being planned for August 3 but may be rescheduled as it does conflict with events the Scotchman and the Rocky Mountain Car and Swap Meet. The Aurora Sports Bar is going to be the meeting place for this event.

It is possible that the Fall trip to the Box Canyon Falls in Ouray, CO will be a 3 day trip August 22-24. The first payment has been made for the Christmas Party. It will be Sunday, December 8, 2024 at Ashley Ridge by Wedgewood located at 8199 Southpark Ct., Littleton, CO 80120. The club will subsidize the cost with \$25 per person which will bring the cost to be around \$90-\$92 per person.

The committee is finding that restaurants are expecting a sizeable room rental fee to accommodate a group as large as ours.

The committee tries to plan most events to be on a Saturday, but there are occasions where a weekday event is necessary.

The parade begins at 11 am and there are other activities for people to enjoy after the parade. They do allow candy to be thrown from the cars

He gave a brief update on the current situation at the National Museum. They have terminated many of their top officials, some that had been there for 30 years. This triggered a chain reaction of other resignations. They are currently searching for new leadership but currently do not have a director or CEO.

Make your dues and event payments with Zelle

Zelle is an online service provided by your bank that allows you to send money from your bank account to LGCA's bank account. Here's how it compares to other payment methods.

Cash payments can only be made at the monthly meetings.

Check payments cost you \$0.68 for postage and take 1 to 3 days for delivery.

PayPal payments cost you and LGCA. On a \$20 event fee you pay \$0.88 and LGCA pays \$1.22. It takes 1 to 3 days to transfer payments from PayPal to LGCA's bank account.

Zelle payments are free. No charge to you. No charge to LGCA. It takes 1 to 3 minutes to transfer the money from your bank account to LGCA's bank account.

Zelle is easy to use. It's one of the menu choices on your banks online banking service. To send money you need to provide LGCA's Zelle credentials. They are:

Zelle Instructions

- 1) Login to your online banking account
- 2) Select Send Money with Zelle from menu
- 3) Click on Send
- 4) Select recipient and enter amount

- 8) You will get an email confirming the payment was sent

Zelle is a fast, safe and low-cost method of making dues and event payments. I ask you to consider using it.

Meeting was held at the ColoRODans clubhouse, 209 Kimbark St., Longmont CO. 16 member clubs were signed in. Officers present were President Dick Thompson, 1st Vice President Tom Mansfield, and Secretary Dick Fritz, President Dick Thompson opened the meeting at 7:47 pm MDT.

Legislation: Leo Boyle described the Legislatures' concluding deliberations as the 2024 session came to a close in May. There were about 750 proposed bills introduced most of which did not become law. Of all bills dealing with the air quality issues only one, SB24-095 might have affected car owners (not just collector vehicles). Amendments to 095 could have added to vehicle emission standards and the area being subject to emission inspections. SB24-095 did not survive but will likely reappear in committee discussions over the summer. Meanwhile a regulation mandating reformulated gasoline has been issued by the Colorado Department of Health and Environment but may only call for reduced volatility.

Minutes for the May meeting were accepted as published.

Treasurer's Report: Dick Thompson presented information submitted by the treasurer. Information as presented was approved. Currently there are 41 member clubs paid or 2024.

June 15 Forney Dust n'Shine: Carroll Reichen is coordinator for CCCC.

Bylaws amendments: At the May meeting there were two proposed amendments to the bylaws. These were to change the club membership requirement (currently 10 members) to either 5 members or to have 10 members to join but the membership could decline. See the attachment to these minutes for specific wording. If neither passes, the bylaws will remain unchanged. If both pass, the conflict will have to be resolved.

Airport Show (August 3rd): Dick Thompson reported that the new director at Rocky Mountain Metro Airport is Erick Dahl and he will be meeting with him to discuss our airport show. RMMA staff are continuing operations without changes at the present time. A list of volunteers needed for the airport show will be presented at the July 3rd CCCC meeting.

Repair shops that cater to older vehicles: Ted Rossi noted that some shops that we have relied on for work on older cars have closed up as the owners retire and we lose their expertise. He has suggested that the CCCC compile a list of shops that we can still rely on for service. This will not constitute endorsement of a shop, just information that clubs have from their experience. Clubs are urged to submit information in writing which CCCC will compile for a general advice listing. Please bring information to the next CCCC meeting (July 3rd).

Next Meeting: The next CCCC meeting will be at the Forney Museum, 4303 Brighton Blvd., Denver Colorado. Start time: 7:31 MDT Wednesday July 3, 2024.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:14 pm MDT.




