September 3, 2024

The meeting was called to order by President Kathy Hall at 7:05 pm because she wanted to allow members a few more minutes to visit. Officers present were **Kathy Hall**, President, **Jane Walker**, Secretary, **Ken Pfohl**, Treasurer and **Bob Burroughs**, Public Relations Officer. **Sandy Seader**, Vice President was absent.

Kathy Ball, Membership announced new directories were available for members that wanted to pick one up. There were also recipes from the Club's Summer Picnic for those interested.

Bob Burroughs, Public Relations Officer did have some response to the business cards he hands out and reported that when he visited with them, they were interested in attending a meeting, however none have actually attended to date.

Ken Pfohl, Treasurer discussed the balances in each account and the months' income and expenses. He explained how to interpret the line items that show expenses, which are sometimes paid before an event then the line showing the income collected from the attendees.

Jane Walker, Secretary will submit an order for name tags for new members and for current members requesting a replacement. Replacement name tags cost the member \$10 while there is no cost to new members for the name tag.

The club purchased a personalized wind chime as a memorial gift for Bob and Laura Duerr.

Kathy Hall, President wished a happy birthday to all members that have August birthdays. She read the names of club members that have signed up to work Friday the 13th and Saturday the 14th for the Emich's Dealer Appreciation Car Show September 14. She encouraged members to wear their name tags at the show.

Bill Hall and **Phil Barnes** gave an update on the organization and planning for the Emich Car Show and said the system for parking the cars has changed some from last year. Currently about 40-42 members have registered their cars and there are approximately 50 non-LGCA cars registered for the show. There may be a few more registering but having about 100 cars would be ideal. Bill showed the club a sample of the awards that will be given out to each class and to the modified classes. LGCA members are not eligible for awards.

The 50-50 raffle proceeds will benefit Dave's Locker and two representatives from Dave's Locker will be there and have a tent set up.

The tables for the food and merchandise will remain as last year.

They have done extensive advertisement for this show by sending emails to 265 emails and 4 flyers with information and reminders. The event has also been posted on Facebook several times.

Minutes of 3 September 2024 Meeting

Meeting was held at the Gateway Classic Cars in Englewood. 18 clubs and 1 Individual member signed in. Officers present were Dick Thompson and Samantha Baker. Meeting was called to order by the president at 7:31PM.

Leo Boyle was unable to attend

Minutes from the August meeting was accepted as published

Treasurer's Report was accepted.

Report from the By Laws Committee:

The committee met and agreed on the following changes to be made to the By Laws:

In Article I. Last sentence of the paragraph, Delete "equal shares among its Member Clubs at that time" and replace with "proportional shares equal to members at the time of most recent renew".

In Article III. 1. Delete "The club must have at least ten (10) members" and replace with "The club must initially have at least ten (10) members". Also in Article III. Last paragraph. Second sentence. Remove "and at each January regular business meeting thereafter".

Article IV. First Paragraph last sentence. Remove "January".

These changes were presented by Carroll Reichen. Motion was made by Carroll Reichen (and seconded by Bret Johnson) to publish them in the minutes of the September 3 meeting. They will then need to be voted on at the Feb 5, 2025 meeting. This will take an affirmative vote of the authorized Representative of at least two-thirds of the Member Clubs of the total current membership roll of the Council. Current membership is 53 clubs so it will need 36 affirmative votes to pass. In order to secure the best possible representation of the member clubs in a vote to amend the Bylaws, the Council will accept absentee ballots, for this purpose only, cast in writing by the authorized Representative of Member Clubs and received by the Secretary of the Council subsequent to publication of any such proposed amendment, but no less than two (2) days prior to the regular business meeting at which such vote to amend is to be conducted (Feb 5, 2025).

It is also required that the two previous motions be withdrawn and no one can remember who made those motions. Maybe the Secretary can research this and this can be done at the Oct 2 meeting.

Lists of shops that cater to collector cars. Ted Rossi was not at the meeting so no new information on this program.

DMV licensing polices and the registration cancellations for historic military vehicles. Leo Boyle, Dick Thompson and Chris Raasch attended the Colorado Department of Revenue meeting and listened to the comments about the CCR 204-10 Rule 3 Non-Traditional Vehicle Title and Registration Eligibility on 8/13/24. The Colorado Department of Revenue cannot do anything about the issue we have as this is the law (SB19-054). So, we will need to find some legislators to sponsor a bill to correct. Leo Boyle is working on this.

Review of August 3rd Airport Show:

Current net income from this show is \$7,125.33 (with \$1,000 still due). This was a very successful event with over 350 classic cars and about 700 spectators.

Two big issues for the show are:

- 1) We need a show manager (either an individual or a club to manage the event). The event also needs managers to manage the Volunteers, Vendors, Sponsors, Displays, Parking and Set up on Friday and Tear down on Saturday.
- 2) The Airport can not supply and drive the Hay Rack wagons next year due to their insurance. We need to come up with another way to get the spectators from the Parking Lot to the show and back.

Zelle is an online service provided by your bank that allows you to send money from your bank account to LGCA's bank account. Here's how it compares to other payment methods.

Cash payments can only be made at the monthly meetings.

Check payments cost you \$0.68 for postage and take 1 to 3 days for delivery.

PayPal payments cost you and LGCA. On a \$20 event fee you pay \$0.88 and LGCA pays \$1.22. It takes 1 to 3 days to transfer payments from PayPal to LGCA's bank account.

Zelle payments are free. No charge to you. No charge to LGCA. It takes 1 to 3 minutes to transfer the money from your bank account to LGCA's bank account.

Zelle is easy to use. It's one of the menu choices on your banks online banking service. To send money you need to provide LGCA's Zelle credentials. They are:

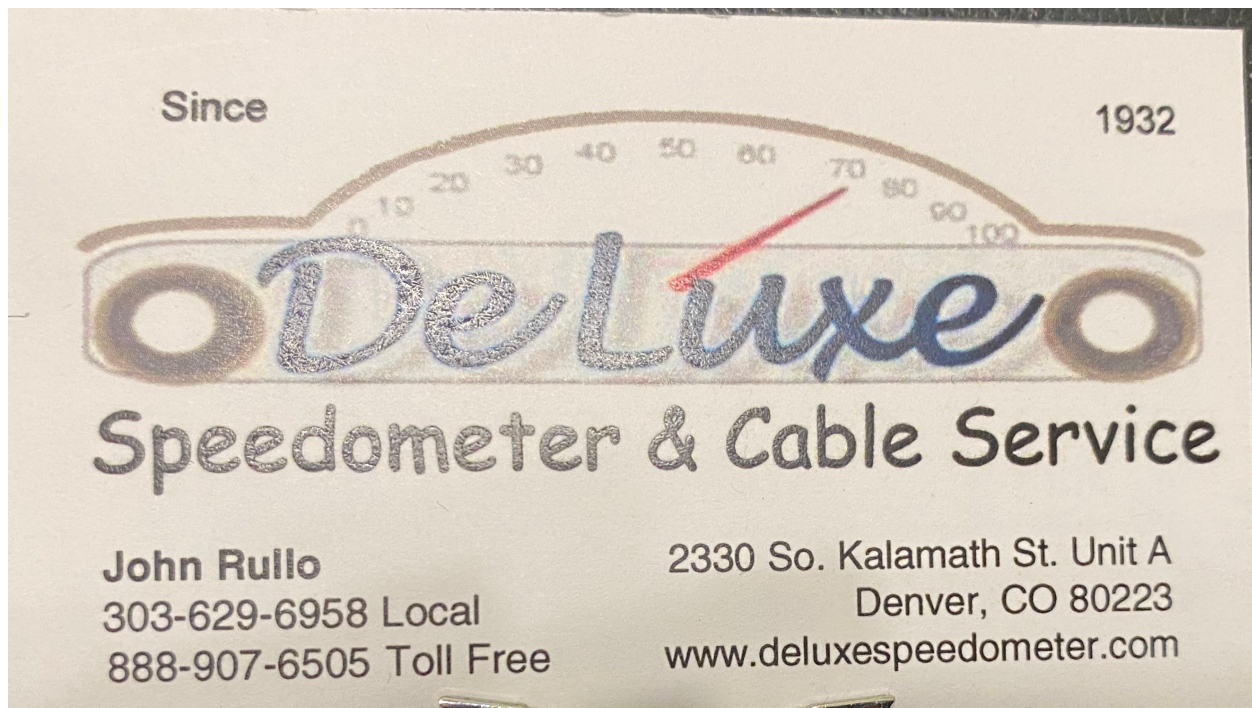
