APRIL 2, 2024

The meeting was called to order by President Kathy Hall at 7:04 pm. Officers present were Kathy Hall, President, Sandy Seader, Vice President, Jane Walker, Secretary, Ken Pfohl, Treasurer and Bob Burroughs, Public Relations.

Presentations for the nominated charities were given.

Kristelle Nielsen and Judy Nielsen spoke and played a short sound clip about "Journey with Equus" located in Elizabeth, CO. This charity rescues horses, donkeys and smaller animals. It is totally dependent on volunteers and donations which provide hay, feed, vet care and hoof care. More information can be found at [www.journeywiththequus.com](http://www.journeywiththequus.com).

Bobby Garrison showed a short video and described the non-profit charity "Dave's Locker." This charity is run by the fire department in Arvada which provides donated used medical equipment such as wheel chairs, walkers, crutches, etc. free of charge to people in need. They receive 300 requests a month.

Phil Barnes requested \$600 for the charity "Ability Connect Colorado." This charity is sponsored by the Concours d'Elegance & Exotic Car Show. Funds raised are used to mentor disabled kids. They educate them and help them become productive citizens by maximizing the potential of every individual. They have a large school near Colfax and help 300-500 children. Treasurer Ken Pfohl described a method the members could consider using to pay for events, membership, etc. called Zelle. It is offered through banks at no charge and is as safe as any money transfer can be. The only information one needs to set up a Zelle account with their bank is a name and phone number or email. Ken will provide more details for the club to consider. He went over the P & L Budget vs Actual handout given to each table. It was suggested that he research Chubb as a possibility for liability insurance. They may be able to offer coverage less than the club is currently paying. Ken concluded that basically the club is in good shape financially.

Secretary Jane Walker shared a letter from the Pulmonary Fibrosis Foundation expressing their appreciation for the \$125 donation given by the club in memory of Patrick Dulin. She also announced that the club has "dangles" to attach to the name tag for years in the club in 5-year increments. If members would like one just let her know. New members will be provided name tags at no charge but if you have misplaced a name tag a replacement can be ordered for \$10.

**Minutes of 2 April 2024 Meeting**

Meeting was held at the Falcon Police Station, 7850 Goddard St., Colorado Springs. 16 member clubs and one guest, Tom Divine of Southern Colorado NSRA, were signed in. Officers present were President Dick Thompson, 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President Calvin Craig, Secretary Dick Fritz, and Treasurer Samantha Baker. Since less than a quorum were present, this was an information meeting (no resolutions).

**Legislation:** Our lobbyist, Leo Boyle, was unable to attend as he had to be at another meeting in Denver. John Mack passed on information from Leo that House Bill 24-1380 dealing with issuance of oil & gas drilling has been killed but four other bills (House and Senate) concerning the ozone air quality problem have yet to be heard in committees. We recognize that amendments threatening use of vehicles can be added even at the last few days of the 2024 legislative session which ends in May.

Minutes for the March meeting were accepted as published.

**Treasurer's Report:** Samantha Baker summarized the balances in the Operating, Government Relations, and Car Show & Swap Meet accounts. The report was approved unanimously.

**Renewal Status and club membership numbers:** The CCCC ByLaws in article III state that a member club must have 10 members. At the present time, several clubs have dropped below that number and will have to be considered inactive and ineligible to vote or be listed on the web site.

**Web site:** Representatives are urged to check the information about their club on the Council's web site ([www.collectorcouncil.com](http://www.collectorcouncil.com)) and advise Ben Aycrigger (Baycrigg@Live.com) if it needs correction.

**Rolls Royce Owners Club:** The RROC Rocky Mountain Region has applied for membership.

**Tri State Show:** There were 11 cars in the club booth area and 6 awards were won. Thanks to everyone who helped out. This was a great opportunity for exchange of ideas with other clubs most of which are in the street rod and muscle car category.

**Gateway Classic Cars Caffeine & Chrome:** The CCCC is to be featured at Gateway on Saturday morning April 27<sup>th</sup>. CCCC will receive \$10 for each vehicle we enter, up to 20 vehicles.

**Lincoln Tech Car Show:** Also on April 27, there will be the annual car show at Lincoln Technical College at 11194 E 45<sup>th</sup> Ave in north Denver from 9 am to 2 pm. We urge members to attend one or the other as they are great opportunities to promote the CCCC.

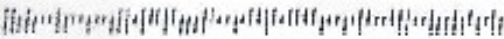

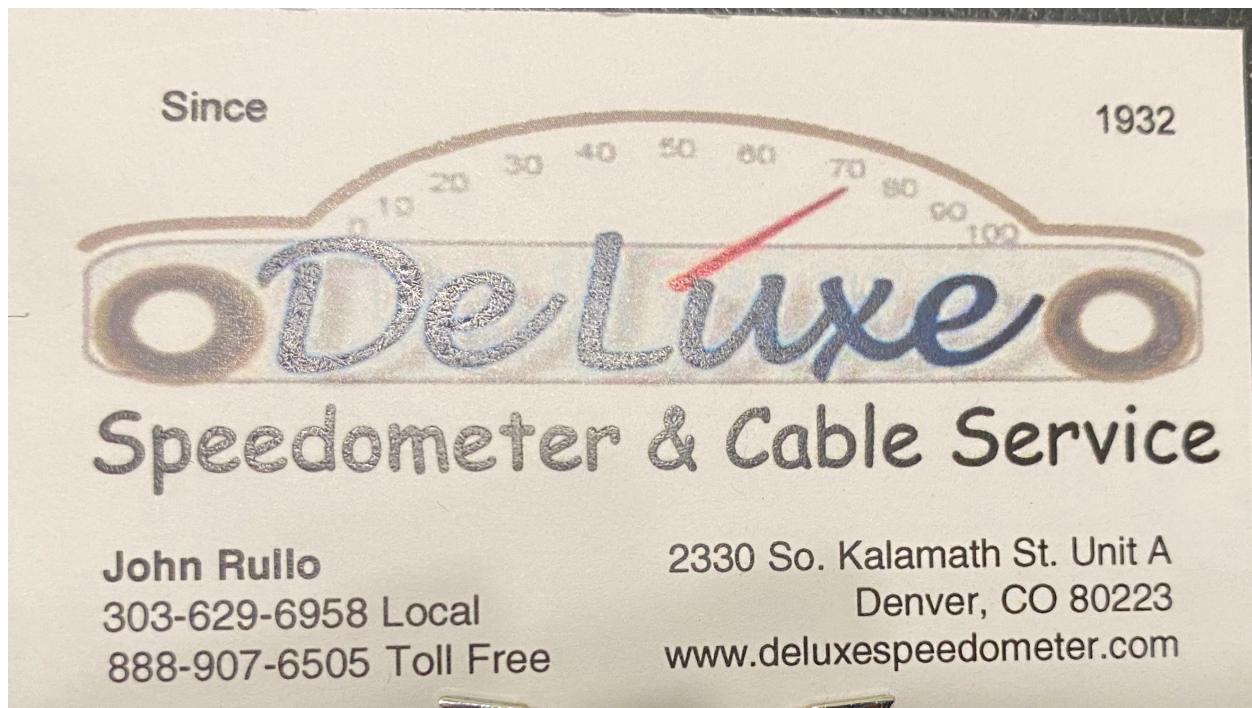
