LOOKING GLASS CORVETTE BUSINESS MEETING MINUTES July 2, 2024

The meeting was called to order by President Kathy Hall at 7:00 pm. Officers present were Kathy Hall, President, Sandy Seader, Vice President, and Jane Walker, Secretary. Ken Pfohl, Treasurer and Bob Burroughs, Public Relations were absent.

George and Bobbie Garrison introduced volunteer Mary and Chief Deanna of Arvada Fire Department, representatives from Dave's Locker, our charity for 2024. They presented a slide show and narrated the origin, purpose and expansion of the organization. It was established in 2017 when one of the firefighters needed a lot of medical equipment for recovery from a hip replacement. After Lt. Dave Matus was fully recovered, he wondered "what should I do with all this equipment?" and the idea of "Dave's Locker" was launched. This organization provides, free of charge, medical equipment to persons in need. They service 550 customers per month, provide 800 pieces of medical devices per month and have 32 volunteers that donate 400 hours of their time per month. They do have a car show fund raiser that benefits the Friends of Fire Protection District. This year it is August 4 from 9 am – 2 pm at Stenger Soccer Complex located at 11200 W 58th Ave. President Kathy Hall then presented them with a check from the club for \$2000.00.

Susan Wozniak, Membership announced there were printed copies of the club's directory on the table, but if you joined after April 4 the updated directory could be found on the website. Lewis Kilborne was in attendance and will be able to join the club after he participates in the Georgetown parade on the 4th. Returning guest Duane Rons was introduced to the club and shared that he has a 2023 Hypersonic Grey C8 convertible with red interior. He lives in the Morrison area and has been a Colorado resident for 50 years.

Kathy Hall shared that Bob Burroughs was having a difficult time navigating Medicare as he sought care and rehabilitation for his mother. She ask the club if there might be interest in having a representative (not a sales persons) speak to the club to help us understand the ins and outs of dealing with Medicare. She ask Kathy Kellett if she volunteer and she accepted.

Kathy Hall reported that Ken Pfohl, Treasurer was out of town helping his son so Sandy Seader handed out the P & L for this month that showed the financials for the club. It included the club receiving \$140 from new member's dues, spending \$278.31 for flowers and memorials, \$1403.77 on merchandise, \$301.70 on parades (to cover the balance due for lunch due to low member attendance) and made the second payment for the Christmas party of \$2,301.00. He also refunded \$40 to a member for cancelation of an event per club guidelines

Sandy Seader, Vice President wished a happy birthday to all members that have July birthdays.

She mentioned she had the laminated cards for new members to pick up to show to Emich for a discount on parts and labor.

Twenty-one members of LGCA brought 14 cars and joined 47 other cars at the fund raiser for the Toy Drive June 22. The fund raiser netted \$1500 in cash and boxes and boxes of toys. It was a great success.

Jane Walker, Secretary announced that new members could pick up their name tags.

At the officers meeting it was noted that the funds for flowers and memorials may need to be increased.

Kathy Hall, President shared a note she received from Deb Raudins thanking the club for the many cards and support she received after her mother's passing. Several members attended the Pistons and Prostate car show sponsored by Emich. She noted not many women attended but would be more likely to attend if it were Brakes and Boobs!!

The Concours d'Elegance June 9 was well attended and the club was recognized for the most attendees at the Gering Car Show June 13-16.

The Rosemont Museum tour and boat ride on June 29 was enjoyed by all that attended. It seems that everyone knew who Leroy Nielsen was by the end of the event!!

Social Committee Chair Judy Nielsen told new members that they were welcome to get the extra "50 Year" medallion the club ordered to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the clubs founding. She also showed them the decals that were available to them.

Regarding the Rosemont Museum outing and River Walk she said there were many restaurants but not many shops. The walk however, was beautiful.

The Georgetown 4th of July Parade details have bee finalized and participants should have received details from Steve Culbertson.

Those attending the Flatlanders Car Show in Sterling, CO will be caravaning from Target. The 18 people and 10 cars going to Lincoln, NE will leave Sterling after lunch on the 7th. Plans still include meeting up with the Nebraska Corvette Club Sunday evening at Blizzard Billie's. The event will include seeing the Kuck Car Collection and a second visit to the Museum of American Speed. The Unser Museum out of Albuquerque is now a part of the museum.

The trip to the Dougherty Museum in Longmont will be July 27. The plan is to meet at 11 am at the Pump House Brewery in Longmont for lunch before the tour. Be aware that parking could be an issue but they thought that at that time of day it should be fine.

Thursday, August 8 is the Toy Run at Children's Hospital.

The mystery trip has been moved to August 10 to avoid a conflict with the Air Show on August 3. We will meet at the Aurora Sport's Bar where there will be a lunch including a nonalcoholic drink for \$20 per person. This is a prepaid event.

August 17 there will be the summer picnic at Mike and Shirley Salazars 14450 E. 134Th Avenue, Brighton. Bring a side dish for 10 people and chairs.

The annual Ice Cream Social is being proposed to be at Austin Hardwoods Sunday, August 25 from 11:30 am – 1:30 pm. This should allow people to see the preseason Bronco game if they choose. Please do sign up so the committee knows how much ice cream to order. It is suggested that participants bring a chair and a small dessert to share.

The committee is planning a tour to Greeley to visit the Rodz and Bodz Museum, Movie Cars & More September 7 with lunch at Georgia Boy's BBQ. The facility has 90,000 square feet and has expanded their collection.

The committee continues to plan a Fall trip over the million-dollar highway to the Box Canyon Falls in Ouray, CO which has been described as a Little Switzerland. They are looking into continuing on to Durango where we could ride the train to Silverton then ride the bus back to Durango. There is a possibility of also including a 3-hour Jeep tour. This would likely be a four-day trip with departure September 19.

In October a day trip to Cripple Creek to include a train ride and lunch is in the works.

In November the club will have their annual Pot Luck before the business meeting at Clements Center and a cookie exchange at Holy Shepherd Lutheran Church at 9th and Kipling.

Regarding the Christmas Party Sunday December 8, if the club has 100 in attendance the price per person drops to \$67 (after the \$25 per person the club contributes.) If only the 80 people we have contracted for attend, even with the \$25 from the club, the price will be around \$90 per person. A couple of leisurely day drives are still being considered for end of summer or early fall.

Car Shows: Phil Barnes recap of the June 9 Concours d'Elegance reported there were 21 vettes, 2/3 of which were from our club. A few of our members received awards. Our President, Kathy Hall had to choose the car that receives the "Black Ribbon" award (the one she liked the best.) It should be noted that she resisted choosing an LGCA car.

Since the engine is not visible in a C8 convertible there are several accessories one can order that would allow some visibility of the engine. A discussion needs to take place regarding the judging as one category is the engine. Phil Barnes and Tom Robben will pursue this issue.

Regarding Cruise-Ins there is a special one, Saturday, July 20 from 3 – 7 pm, the Englewood High Cruise Night where they cruise Broadway after the car show.

Last week 4 cars from LGCA went to the Show Us Your Chevy car show where there were about 200 cars. Sunday, July 28 at the Greeley Fairgrounds there will be a car show. It is free and cars will be parked on grass. At the pavilion there will be a BBQ lunch with a band.

August 3 is the Scotsman Show by the 4 C's car club. There is a \$30 registration fee but you do get a T-shirt

The Emich appreciation Car Show on September 14 now has 44 cars registered with 15 from LGCA.

Donna Fitsgerald thanked all the members that participated in the fund raiser for the Children's Hospital Toy drive. She specifically thanked the LGCA members, Patty Murry, Sandy Seader and her Niece, Torrie for their efforts in getting donations and door prizes. Twenty-five club members brought 14 cars to the event. Following the delivery, we will meet for lunch at the Los Dos Potrillos Mexican restaurant.

Minutes of 3 July 2024 Meeting

Meeting was held at the Forney Museum, 4303 Brighton Blvd., Denver CO. 22 member clubs and one independent member were signed in. Officers present were President Dick Thompson, 2nd Vice President Calvin Craig, Secretary Dick Fritz, and Treasurer Samantha Baker. The meeting was called to order by the president at 7:34 pm MDT.

Legislation: Leo Boyle reported that the legislative session that ended in May did not pass Senate Bill 24-095 but he expects that elements will be revived in the 2025 legislative session which begins in January next year. 095 dealt with expansion of motor vehicle emission standards and inspections. This will bear watching. Leo noted that Colorado's November elections will shuffle new and old legislators but probably not change the Democrat/Republican ratios. There will be new members on the transportation committees

Minutes for the June meeting were accepted as published.

Treasurer's Report: Samantha Baker reported that as on the end of June, the renewals for 2024 were up to 44 clubs, and an additional 3 are added in July. The report was approved unanimously.

Gateway Classic Cars Caffeine & Chrome: The CCCC is to be featured at Gateway on Saturday morning July 27th. CCCC will receive \$10 for each vehicle we enter, up to 20 vehicles. Proposed Bylaw amendments: The two amendments dealing with changing the membership requirement to join the Council were discussed at length but the two quorum requirements (to hold a vote and to pass an amendment) were not understood. The president tabled holding a vote until the February 2025 Presidents' Night Meeting, after a bylaws committee considers these and other provisions that may need to be changed. Absentee ballots that were submitted will be held but they may be rescinded by their clubs if requested.

Repair shop lists: The information about repair shops that still cater to vintage vehicles should be submitted to Ted Rossi by email (Tedrossi1957@gmail.com) or USPS (Ted Rossi, 1325 W.148th Ave., Westminster CO 80023). Shop name, address, and special services should be included. The listings will NOT be recommendations, only a source of information.

Airport Show (August 3!): A list of needed volunteers to carry out the car show and swap meet will be sent to all club representatives and it is URGENT that we get volunteers signed up. Shifts are only for two hours and will be greatly appreciated. Samantha has set up a meeting with the airport staff on Tuesday, April 9. 


