BURLINGTON, COLORADO was the answer to where we were traveling for our MYSTERY TRIP on August 10th. Burlington was established in 1888 as a junction town for the railroads. Burlington provides the "simple life" for residents and their motto is

"Colorado's backyard - where the fun begins."

We had 22 cars of beautiful colors cruising down I-70 East. Upon arrival in Burlington, we loaded onto red wagons for about 7 block ride to the KIT CARSON COUNTY CAROUSEL. It was built in 1905 by the Philadelphia Toboggan Company for ELITCH GARDENS in Denver. It was purchased in 1928 and was moved and fully restored to its original condition for Colorado's Centennial in 1976. It features 46 hand carved animals – all have intricate carvings, detailed coats, real antlers on the deer and real horse tails on many of the horses. Music is provided by a 1912 Wurlitzer Monster Military Band Organ.

We then toured OLD TOWN MUSEUM – 61/2-acre historic site includes 21 fully restored buildings with authentic artifacts from the turn-of-the -century. We were entertained by a high-noon cancan show in the Saloon and live gunfights in the street. We were treated to an enjoyable catered lunch in the saloon and then set free to explore the buildings. The Emporium at Old Town is a shopper's delight featuring handcrafted collectibles, gifts and souvenirs.

What a delightful day and terrific weather for exploring and being with friends.

Thank you to Cindi, Tony and Judy for a unique adventure. "WELL DONE" Kathy














Vice President's Report

LOOKING GLASS CORVETTE BUSINESS MEETING MINUTES

August 6, 2024

The meeting was called to order by President Kathy Hall at 7:00 pm. Officers present were Kathy Hall, President, Sandy Seader, Vice President, Jane Walker, Secretary, Ken Pfohl, Treasurer and Bob Burroughs, Public Relations Officer.

Kathy Hall introduced member Kathy Kellett a representative for Medicare. She gave an overview of Medicare explaining the various plans and supplement policies available to seniors 65 years and older. Medicare does not cover prescription drugs but supplemental plans can be purchased that do. These Supplemental plans also can cover things Medicare does not. She explained that an HMO requires the person to use physicians and services in network while a PPO plan allows one to go out of network. Another factor that determines premiums people pay is the surcharge called IRMAA (Income Related Monthly Adjustment Amount) which adds to the monthly Medicare premium based on income. She cautioned that if you have a drug plan you should check each year to see if your drugs are covered as it changes every year.

Susan Wozniak, Membership stated there were no visitors or potential members in attendance.

Bob Burroughs, Public Relations Officer continues to hand out business cards with his contact information but hadn't received any calls back.

Ken Pfohl, Treasurer updated the financial standing of the club for the month of July.

Jane Walker, Secretary will be ordering new member and replacement name tags next month so if anyone is in need of a replacement name tag let her know. She also reminded members that she had the dangles in 5 year increments that members can pick up after the meeting.

Minutes of 7 August 2024 Meeting

Meeting was held at the Forney Museum, 4303 Brighton Blvd., Denver CO. 21 member clubs and two independent members were signed in. Officers present were President Dick Thompson, First Vice President, Tom Mansfield, Secretary Dick Fritz, and Treasurer Samantha Baker. The meeting was called to order by the president at 7:31 pm MDT. Two new representatives were introduced: Bob Steffen of the Rocky Mountain Thunderbird Club and Eddie Maurer of the Conestoga Chapter, Studebaker Drivers Club.

Legislation: Leo Boyle was unable to attend.

Minutes for the July meeting were accepted as published.

Treasurer's Report: Samantha Baker summarized the funds in the operating, government relations, and swap meet / car show accounts as of the end of July, but noted that some bills for the airport show have yet to come in.

Repair shop lists: The information about repair shops that still cater to vintage vehicles should be submitted to Ted Rossi by email (<u>Tedrossi1957@gmail.com</u>) or USPS (Ted Rossi, 1325 W.148th Ave., Westminster CO 80023). Shop name, address, and special services should be included. The listings will NOT be recommendations, only a source of information. WE NEED MORE INPUT.

Airport Show: In spite of very hot weather and smoke from wildfires, the show at Rocky Mountain Metro Airport was very well attended. There were about 30% fewer cars and spectators but the response from attendees was favorable. Samantha Baker was thanked for her management of the show. Samantha will have to resign from next year's event, but she has recommendations for future shows; primarily she urged having 5 sub-managers so the overall manager does not have to be everywhere at once. Club representatives were asked to seek suggestions and comments from their clubs for improving the event. There will be a wrap-up meeting for the car show at the airport terminal meeting room at 4:30 of Tuesday, August 20th. Note: this meeting will be for airport issues only; there may be a general car show wrap-up meeting following, location to be determined.

DMV meeting re: Non-traditional vehicle title and registration eligibility. The DMV will hold a workshop on Tuesday, August 13 to clarify eligibility of unconventional vehicles such as golf carts and surplus military vehicles for registration. We intend to have representatives at the virtual meeting.

SEMA Show: John Ehrlich reported that Colby Martin of SEMA has not advised us if or how many comp passes might be available to CCCC.

Forney Dust n'Shine events: CCCC is scheduled to be the volunteer organization for September 21.

Notify Dick Thompson is you would like to attend. Also, clubs that wish to hold a Dust n'Shine in 2025 should contact Dick Thompson.

Bylaws review committee: There will be a meeting of those who volunteered (plus anyone else who would like to help) on Monday, August 19 at 4 pm at the Forney Museum.

Tax reporting for 2023: Dick Thompson reported that taxes have been filed for 2023.

Next Meeting: The September CCCC meeting will be at Gateway Classic Cars at 14150 Grasslands Dr. in Englewood. To accommodate Gateway's schedule, the meeting will be held on Tuesday, September 3rd.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:13 pm MDT.

PayPal payments cost you and LGCA. On a \$20 event fee you pay \$0.88 and LGCA pays \$1.22. It takes 1 to 3 days to transfer payments from PayPal to LGCA's bank account.

Zelle payments are free. No charge to you. No charge to LGCA. It takes 1 to 3 minutes to transfer the money from your bank account to LGCA's bank account.

Zelle is easy to use. It's one of the menu choices on your banks online banking service. To send money you need to provide LGCA's Zelle credentials. They are:




