Every new Corvette comes with an invitation for a "discounted rate of \$1,000.00" - not including travel expenses on an exclusive 2-day course at the RON FELLOWS PERFORMANCE DRIVING SCHOOL AT SPRING MOUNTAIN MOTOR RESORT AND COUNTRY CLUB. You have one year from the date of delivery to take your driving course - dates are limited.

It started as a simple idea – a racetrack where friends and family could enjoy the thrill and excitement of a world-class road course with the relaxation and resort atmosphere of a country club setting. Together racing enthusiasts John Morris and Brad Rambo bought the 193-acre property now known as SPRING MOUNTAIN MOTOR RESORT AND COUNTRY CLUB in 2004. In October 2008 RON FELLOWS partnered with Spring Mountain, forming the Ron Fellow Performance Driving "School along with corporate partners CHEVROLET AND MICHELIN. It now has the longest racetrack in North America at 9.13 miles with over 70 configurations available on 933 acres of motorsports paradise. A multitude of amenities include gourmet kitchen and onsite chef - outdoor patio, fire pits, pool and jacuzzi, fitness center outdoor basketball court, and gun range. The school is a 2-day course from 8:00am to 4:00pm which includes breakfast at 6:45am to 8am and a lunch break in the Clubhouse. The programs are designed to provide drivers of all experience levels with the skills and techniques needed to truly challenge yourself and become more knowledgeable and confident in the incredible capabilities of your new corvette.

#### Minutes of 1 May 2024 Meeting

Meeting was held at the Forney Museum of Transportation, 4303 Brighton Blvd., Denver CO. 23 member clubs, representatives of two prospective member clubs, and two individual members were signed in. Officers present were 1st Vice President Tom Mansfield, 2st Vice President Calvin Craig, Secretary Dick Fritz, and Treasurer Samantha Baker. The 1st Vice President, Tom Mansfield opened the meeting at 7:31 pm MDT.

Legislation: Our lobbyist, Leo Boyle reported that the Colorado Legislature is going into overdrive to conclude everything by the May 8th legal deadline to end the 2024 session. Violation of the Ozone Air Quality standard has been a concern all year and the oil & gas industry, particularly the Suncor refinery, has been the primary target. One remaining bill, SB24-095, deals with high-emitter vehicles and authorizes a voucher for additional remediating repairs. Further amendments may be added to this bill. No other bills this year had affected collector vehicles.

Minutes for the April meeting were accepted as published.

Treasurer's Report: Samantha Baker summarized the balances in the Operating, Government Relations, and Car Show & Swap Meet accounts. The report was approved unanimously.

Applications for membership: Faith on Wheels Car Club and Rolls-Royce Owners Club representatives were introduced and asked to describe their clubs. After discussion, their applications were moved, seconded, and approved unanimously.

CCCC bylaws and club membership numbers: The requirement in the CCCC bylaws that clubs must have at least 10 members has become controversial as membership in several clubs has dropped below that

number. After extended discussion, two possible alternative changes were put forward: [A] That the requirement be changed to five members, and/or [B] that a club have 10 members to initially join but the number of members can subsequently drop below that number. All clubs are asked to discuss with their members (including the option of leaving the figure at 10 members) and present their recommendation at the next CCCC meeting. There is a formal procedure for changing the bylaws, as attached as an addendum to these minutes.

Gateway Classic Cars Caffeine & Chrome: The two events scheduled for April 27 were both impacted by the spring snow and rain storm. Lincoln Tech's car show was postponed to September 14 and the Gateway Caffeine and Chrome went on but with fewer cars. We appreciate the five CCCC club members who signed in and for which the Council will receive a check for \$50.

Tom Mansfield reported that volunteers will be needed at the August 3<sup>rd</sup> CCCC Airport Show. A list of where volunteers are needed should be compiled for an upcoming meeting.

June 15 Forney Dust n'Shine: This date had been scheduled for the Rocky Mountain Corsa Club but due to a conflict they had to be rescheduled to September 21. CCCC has taken over the June 15<sup>th</sup> date.

Carroll Reichen (Tammev.Stone@ucdenver.edu or 303-797-8912) will oversee volunteers and he must have a head count of who will coming. The number will be limited to 20. The Pontiac club asked to be a major participant. Do not show up without registering in advance.

Next Meeting: The June 5th meeting will be at ColoRODans meeting room, 209 Kimbark St., Longmont Colorado. Start time 7:31 MDT.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:32 pm MDT.

Addendum: CCCC Bylaws: Article IX: AMENDMENT

C

Amendments to these Bylaws of the Collector Car Council may be proposed by the authorized Representative of any Member Club in good standing for consideration and discussion. An amendment will be adopted only following publication in the minutes of the regular business meeting at which it is proposed and with the affirmative votes of the authorized Representatives of at least two-thirds of the Member Clubs of the total current membership roll of the Council.

In order to secure the best possible representation of the Member Clubs in a vote to amend the Bylaws, the Council will accept absentee ballots, for this purpose only, cast in writing by the authorized Representatives of Member Clubs and received by the Secretary of the Council subsequent to publication of any such proposed amendment, but no less than two (2) days prior to the regular business meeting at which such vote to amend is to be conducted.




